All undergraduate students (except Music EC-12, Art EC-12, and TNT) who wish to apply for admission to Teacher Education are required to complete an online Teacher Education admission questionnaire on the College of Education's Tk20 website.

You will receive a confirmation from Tk20 when you submit your responses to the questionnaire. Please print a copy of the confirmation page as you are required to submit the confirmation with your Teacher Education application. - Admission Questionnaire confirmation page from Tk20
- Application for admission to Teacher Education

You will be notified regarding the status of your application for admission to Teacher Education through your UNT email account within 10 business days of when you submit all required documents.

Admission to Teacher Education

A student must be admitted to the Teacher Education Program before enrolling in most EDEE, EDRE, EDBE, EDME, EDSE and EDSP courses. To be admitted a student must:

- be a junior (60 credit hours earned);
- have minimum THEA scores of 240 reading, 230 math, and 220 writing;
- have a 2.75 overall GPA or a 2.75 GPA in the completed core; and
- be actively enrolled at UNT and have a degree plan completed or in process in the Student Advising Office.

Continuation in the Teacher Education Program is not guaranteed by the admission process.

Professional Development School (PDS)

Students will participate in a Professional Development School during the final two long semesters of their degree/certification program which requires they be available during normal public school hours. Students must meet all pre-requisites to participate in PDS and participate in public school field placements. UNT and participating school districts require a criminal history check prior to field experience.

Recommendation for Teacher Certificate

To be recommended for certification, the student must have

- been Admitted to Teacher Education;
- successfully completed all required academic courses;
- successfully completed all required professional field experiences;
- maintained GPA requirements as stated on his/her plan; and
- passed the required TExES exams.

UNT will share your information with the Texas Education Agency (TEA) upon admission to teacher education. All communication from the Student Advising Office and TEA will be through your EagleConnect account. Certification is completed by application to TEA at www.tea.state.tx.us. Although the College of Education at the University of North Texas (UNT) recommends the student to TEA, the final authority to confer the teacher certificate remains with the State Board for Education Certification (SBEC). SBEC policy requires that each applicant pass a criminal history check conducted by SBEC before certification is issued.
