



UNT ACCELERATED MASTER'S DEGREE IN EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY

The Department of Educational Psychology offers a combined degree program in which students can complete both a Bachelor's Degree and a Master's Degree in an accelerated manner. Academically strong students receive an undergraduate degree in their chosen field of study and a graduate degree in Educational Psychology in as few as 5 years.

The focus of this concentration is on developmental issues across the lifespan with an emphasis on motivation, acquisition of information, and learning theories and strategies. **Graduate courses include:**

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REQUIREMENTS OF THE PROGRAM:

In order to be eligible, students must:

- Have a minimum overall GPA of 3.5.
- Have completed a total of 75 undergraduate hours of coursework by the end of the semester in which they apply.
- Be classified as a senior (with at least 90 completed hours) by the start of their first "grad track" semester.

- Maintain a minimum overall GPA of 3.0 in each of their "grad track" semesters.
